

Good day Brothers!

For the new year, I have changed the calendar format somewhat. To closer resemble the 23rd Masonic District Calendar I have color coded entries for different categories of events and appendant bodies. Below is a list of what colors mean what. I'll leave this slide here in front of the calendar for everyone for a few months until we all get used to the changes.

Blue: These are the locations of events held at Blue Lodges such as @ Venice Lodge 301. The same color also corresponds to appendant bodies that meet at a Lodge, such as Trinity Commandry meeting at Venice Lodge, appendant bodies' colors are noted below or at a restaurant or other meeting place.

Purple: These are appendant bodies having events or meetings such as the Queen of Hearts Drawing or the previously mentioned Trinity Commandry.

Red: These entries are events and meetings that concern the entire district such as the monthly Master Mason Association (MMA) Meeting or Open Books.

Green: This is for youth organizations such as C. Allen Pattison DeMolay and Rainbow Girls No. 38. You will notice that this also follow the same format as appendant bodies meeting at a lodge as their location is also in blue.

Orange: This notes the specific events, usually at Lodges, such as a **Stated Meeting**. This will also include, but not limited to, installation of officers, degrees and degree practices or open houses.

Entries on the calendar are in order by time, earliest events at the top. Within that context, events are in the following order:

- ⇒ Blue Lodge Events
- ⇒ Appendant Bodies Events
- ⇒ District Events
- ⇒ Youth Events

If you do not see a Lodge event on a date but do see youth event, then there is no Lodge event

The format of the district has calendar has also changed, all events are separated into their own separate calendars so it might take some time to get used to the new look. If you see an issue with any events, please let me know so it can be corrected.



MASONIC YOUTH ACTIVITIES COMMITTEE PROGRAM 2025-2026

My Brothers, Thank you for accepting a position with the Masonic Youth Activities Committee. It's a great opportunity to make a difference in the life of a young man or young woman. This program outline will be almost an exact replica of last year's program which spelled out the duties and responsibilities of these positions extremely well. I asked for and received the permission of last years State Chairman to plagiarize his outline, and I plagiarized the heck out of it. Please review it in detail; there's a lot of great information, direction, and thoughtful suggestions included therein.

DeMolay, Rainbow, and Job's Daughters are the three greatest youth organizations in the world that no one has ever heard of. It's our job to get the word out as much as possible. In today's world of social media, computer games, and "virtual realities" its hard to convince young people to put down the phone, sign off the computer, and get involved with a group most have never heard of. It's our job to explain our organizations to them, and even more importantly, their parents. I've learned that once parents understand the precepts of our organizations, they are very open to their children joining. So, I'm going to ask you to focus on some key points this year:

Remember in all our efforts we have the privilege and honor to represent the Grand Master of The Grand Lodge of Florida and our conduct should always reflect that fact.
